<u>Water Meter Replacement</u> – the NFWB completed a water meter replacement pilot program on Cayuga Island. The new meters are more accurate and will allow the time to reading of meters to be cut from 14 days down to 1 hour.

Status: Completed

Goal: Reduce WWTP flow and costs by reducing sewer system infiltration.

Project Cost: \$6.2M

Goal : Replace 20 year old water meters

Goal: Water system upgrade by prioritized watermain replacement

Project Cost: \$0.3M

In 2012, the new 10" D.I.P. water main installation along Buffalo Avenue began during the week of August 13th at the 47th Street interconnection no.1 location (sta. B 125+75, W 1+00). The majority of the 10" water main was installed to the east project limit at the 63rd Street interconnection no.11 location (sta. B 173+50, W 49+00) by the end of October 2012.

Approximately 4,800 LF of 10" D.I.P water main was installed in 2012.

Bond – \$ 7,291,520.00 per year. Re-bonding initiated with an estimated cost savings of over \$300,000.00 per year, every year over the next 20 years.

<u>Initiated the Digital Archiving of Records</u> - NFWB received a grant for \$36,000.00 to digitally archive historical data to insure the retention of mandated information is adhered to for future access.

<u>Initiate City-wide water meter replacement</u> – the NFWB will execute a city-wide program to install new water meters. The current water meters have not been replaced since 1990. The new water meters will be more accurate and enable the reading of meters to be done more efficiently, thereby passing the cost savings onto the consumer. Installation begins in the Spring 2013.

Security:

Approximate costs of 2012 security upgrades (not including incidentals):

West gate keypad: \$975

8 new cameras (4 in operations, 4 in hallway to storeroom): \$850

Repair of gate arms: incidental (less than \$50)

Repairs to lobby security system: \$500

Lobby keypad was installed in 2011.

Fencing in 2012 was \$20,229.
